Police presence was more than double the people in the march closed Wash Sq park area. They have a group of people who are to calm down incidents/de-escalate. They get themselves very centered beforehand. They handle counter-protests really well. They use bike marshals. They stopped and made some speeches which were successful. We could learn some things from Xr. They had about 200 people, beautiful props. The scouting was not well-done so there were delays. Stoppage challenged the police.

UPCOMING ACTIONS

Democracy Dies in a Police State—Sept. 17 at 5 pm

Stu: Hopefully, the first of many. Looks back on what happened in the past few months with BLM—police riots where people were pulled, dragged etc. Where the police inflicted unnecessary violence on non-violent protesters. Have photos. Calling on DeBlasio to take charge but calling out the entire country. Where police crush dissent with force is the target. NY is particularly egregious. Mayor who does not walk the talk. The East side of City Hall is a meeting place. It's on FB. Expect a lot of police. Chanting, speeches with bull horn. This is an important topic. Starts with Trump and it's spreading all over the country. The FB post is very visceral and they wanted it shared widely. Have signs that come down on DeBlasio. He always tries to duck out and we are at City Hall because DeBlasio needs to take responsibility. DB will be called out.

IF Trump comes to Speak at the UN General Assembly—Sept. 22

Jamie: This visit got some press in July, a bit in August, but it has been very quiet lately. This week NPR mentioned he is coming in person to speak but they may want to downplay it. Not clear if he is going to show up but we want something planned and ready to go. Usually he flies into a heliport in lower Manhattan. There's a good place we can stand near the heliport with signs. We have gotten him there before but.....worth having something ready.

Want to go with signs. Series of 20 X30—each piece had a letter. Go Away loser and on the other side said "Impeach". NO MORE YEARS as one message and for the flip side it could be IN OUT, DETHRONE TRUMP. THERE ARE 13 LETTERS IN NO MORE YEARS—NEED 13 PEOPLE PLUS SPARES PLUS ART DIR, PHOTOGRAPHERS, Overall, need at least 20 people Monday night through Tuesday morning.

Want permission to go forward so we can make the props. Will get the Actions Committee to paint them. This signage is better than the No More Years banner. Need approval to do the

action. Want to spend some \$ to get foam core boards and paint.

Can't pinpoint the time yet. Could be 8 am on Tuesday. Will need to signal and email to figure it out. Might wait 2 to 3 Hours. Prop date will be Saturday.

NYCC Action at Blackrock—Sept. 17 At 1 pm

Palantir has a public offering next week and they need to look good. This action is meant to make Palantir look bad. 45 E. 51st St. Huge chalk word outlines on the sidewalk to be done beforehand. Petitions will be delivered to BlackRock. Will be live streamed.

March for Climate Justice Through Racial Justice—Sept. 20

Livvie: Another climate action on Sept. 20—already approved—climate justice action March for Climate Justice Through Racial Justice. Focus is on Racial Justice but it's sponsored by climate groups.

Decolonize the DOW—Sept. 18

Discussion of what we can / should do if there is no clear outcome of the election on Nov. 4

Jamie Introduction: Trump cannot declare victory by himself

The election can't be called until every vote is tallied. Two links—waging non-violence; choose democracy—talks about pressuring gov't to count every vote. Focus on some things we can do ahead of the Election.

There were a variety of themes that were mentioned but all agreed that we had to hit the streets if Trump does not respect the democratic process after the election and we need to do it in large numbers.

Others mentioned coalitions and that there are many other groups out there planning similar events. The feeling was that we should be in agreement about what we, as RaR, want to do before we enter into coalitions with others.

Several mentioned the importance of holding the media accountable for telling a narrative that supports democracy and not just focus on getting ratings and entertainment.

A few acknowledged that it is highly unlikely we'll know the result on Election Night and that expectation should get set as far ahead of the election as possible. One person mentioned that it would be good to know which states count their absentee ballots ahead of election day and, if those results, could be available, they could give us a sense for how the election results would ultimately go. Democrats, as everyone knew, are many times more likely to sign up to vote by mail or request an absentee ballot.

Some felt we should consider holding back and let the MAGA folks go crazy. This could make huge peaceful demonstrations on our part more effective.

Some other suggestions and comments included:

--Having a VOTE banner

--Prepare for a long, ugly slog

--If a Biden win is clear but Trump ignores, trips to DC and the Whitehouse may be necessary

--Important to pay attention to the damage Trump can do between November 3 and January 20

--We should have direct action workshops to prepare lots of people to get into the streets

Many talked about the need to be united and together, to be kind to one another and care for each other during what will likely be a difficult time.
